

El home learning – A truck/lorry to Italy

Communication, language and literacy

Can you find things around your home beginning with the letters I and T that you can take on holiday with you? Why not collect a few things together in a basket such as a towel, ice-cream, tops etc.

Why not try learning some Italian words such as - Ciao (Hello)

- Ciao (Goodbye)
- Grazie (thankyou)
- Si (Yes)
- Prego (you're welcome).

Numeracy

See if you can count to 10 and back again.

Delivery driver (resource on website) Can you count 10 parcels into the delivery truck? How many are you delivering today? How many are left? Ask your family members how many parcels they ordered and take them away from the truck and count how many there will be left? Once they have been delivered, why not collect the parcels back adding them up to ensure there is 10.

Create a lorry using Lego/truck, how many wheels does it have? How many Lego pieces have you used?

Shapes- Using different shapes can you draw your own truck/lorry?

Counting in Italian- can you count to 10 in Spain – uno, due, tre, quattro, cinque, sei, sette, otto, nove, dieci.

Going outdoors/ playing

Why not try the Italian national dance – there are some wonderful videos on You Tube which you can watch to see how the dancers move.

Target games- place an item on the grass/ back garden (the target) and using beanbags, balls, hoops etc see who can throw their beanbag/hoop etc the closest.

Using chalk to write your name on the ground.

You could make a tally chart to record how many trucks/lorries you see. You could use the tally for colour or size or how many wheels it has.

You could try making a lorry using junk box modelling. How many compartments does it have, how many people does it carry? Can you make it bigger? How many wheels does it need now? You could decorate it using a variety of resources.

Draw the Italian flag – there is a template on Twinkl. Can you decorate it using a variety of resources? Design a new outfit for your holiday, using the template placed onto the school website can you create a new t-shirt or shorts for your person?

Creating a restaurant in your home, why not ask family members to come to your restaurant to try your delicious pizzas. Remember to ask them which toppings they would like on.

Design your own passport- using the template given on the school website.

Understanding of the world

Look at different lorries/trucks and talk about what they are used for- for example cargo lorries carry cargo, vehicle carriers take various vehicles such as tractors to destinations.

Look at different pictures of Italy and the city Rome. Look at all the different landmarks that are there.

Focus on the landmarks within the city of Rome such as;

Colosseum- what happened there?

Pantheon – what is it used for?

Vatican- Who lives there? What does he do?

What other things can you find out about Rome?

Focus on the landmarks with the city of Pisa such as;

The leaning tower- why does it lean? Why was it built?

Personal, social and emotional development

Dumper truck of emotions- imagine being a dumper truck driver and you have a lot of feelings, some which you would want to get rid of. Work through the activity on the website 'Dumper truck of emotions'.

Talking about various vehicles- Show your child a variety of vehicles from old to new and talk about what they are used for. Create a discussion of where you may have seen the different vehicles. Why not ask grandparents/ great grandparents/ neighbours which vehicles they remember from when they were younger- do they still see them on the roads today? You could ask them if they have any photos of the olden day vehicles.

Baking

You could try making a pizza together as a family and enjoy it for tea.

You could also try making your own croissants for breakfast.
