

Fl home learning – A plane to Spain

Communication, language and literacy

Can you find things around your home beginning with S that you can take on holiday with you? Why not collect a few things together in a basket such as sun cream, sunhat, shades, sandals etc.

Why not try learning some Spanish words such as - Hola (Hello)

- Adios (Goodbye)

- Friend (Amigo)

- Buenas noches (Good night)

- Buenos dias (good morning)

Going on a plane journey sequencing – Twinkl resource.

Numeracy

See if you can count to 20 and back again.

Pretend you are on a plane- can you line up cushions for seats on the plane? How many seats have you created? Can you add your teddies to the cushions- How many seats are spare? How many are filled?

Shapes- Can you find objects within your house with different shapes within. Which shapes can you see? Can you draw the shapes on paper and label each one?

Counting in Spanish- can you count to 10 in Spain – uno, dos, tres, cuarto, cinco, seis, siete, ocho, nueve, diez.

Going outdoors/ playing

Why not try flamenco dancing – there are some wonderful videos on You Tube which you can watch to see how the dancers move.

Pretend to be a plane and fly around the garden with your family members- are you a fast or slow plane?

Reading

Topsy and Tim go on an aeroplane- You can find it on YouTube

Maisy goes by plane – You can find it on You Tube

Up and down – You can find it on You Tube (little boy and a penguin)

Pencil control

Why not draw an aeroplane and place all your family members inside? Can you make a new style plane?

Art and design

You could try making an aeroplane using junk box modelling. You could paint it too if you like.

Why not make your own paper aeroplane – you could colour it using pens and crayons

There is a Lancaster bomber paper model aeroplane which you could print out and make with your family members.

Draw the Spanish flag – there is a template on Twinkl. Can you decorate it using a variety of resources?

Make a sun hat for your holiday- use a variety of colours and resources to add to the hat to make it unique.

Creating repeated patterns using beats such as 'copy me game' one person claps in a pattern and other family members copy this. You could –clap, clap, clap,

-clap, tap head, clap.

- clap, tap knee, tap knee, clap etc

Understanding of the world

Powerpoint on Twinkl 'All about airports'

Look at different aeroplanes and talk about what they are used for- for example cargo planes carry cargo, passenger planes take people on holiday, RAF planes support the forces.

Look at different pictures of Spain and the different landmarks there are there. Focus on cities such as Barcelona where you can visit the Sagrada familia.

Personal, social and emotional development

Talking about planes- Show your child a variety of aeroplanes from old to new and talk about what aeroplanes do. Create a discussion of where you have been on an aeroplane and what they are like. (do they like them or not) If you have not yet been on an aeroplane yet, ask your child where they would like to go when you do go. Why not have a look through old family photos and talk about the things you all enjoyed

Baking

You could try making a paella together as a family and enjoy it for tea.

Why not try making a ginger cake- encourage the children to weigh out the different ingredients and use utensils to mix it together. Talk about how the ingredients are a liquid and then once baked they turn to a more solid form.

Use different fruits to make an aeroplane fruit masterpiece; you could use wooden skewers to hold the fruit in place.
