		Guy Fawkes	A man who was involved in a plan to attack the Parliament and King James I.
		Nativity	A play that tells the story of Jesus Christ's birth
		Christmas	Christmas is celebrated on 25 December. It is a holiday to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, who, according to the Christian religion, is the son of God.
		Reflective	Light that bounces off an object or surface.
		Safety	Safety is anything that people do to protect themselves or others from harmful accidents
		Remembrance Sunday	Remembrance Day gives people the chance to remember those who fought and lost their lives during the war and honour their memory.
