As part of our on going safeguarding in school I am going to keep you informed about E-Safety issues. Part of this information sharing is this newsletter but I am also happy to set up an E-Safety course for you to attend to hopefully learn a little more about what we do in school and how you can help to ensure your child uses all electronic devices safely.

School Website

You will see on the school website a section on E-Safety which is well worth a look. You will be able to find some online resources as well as links to report abuse. We will be adding to this as time goes on.



1. To avoid running up charges for purchasing additional game play turn off 'In App Purchases':
For the Ipad this can be found by:
'Settings-General-restrictions-enable restrictions-turn off in app purchase (move down the screen)'
2. Or to have your password required for each action:
'Settings-general-restrictions-enable restrictions-requires password-immediately'
3. Also, use your tablet/PC etc with your child to demonstrate how to get rid of pop-ups. Pop-ups can easily lead to costs.
When a pop-up arrives: 1. Ignore
2. Close down (click on the x)

If you can get your children to do this each time then costly mistakes are less likely.




Reporting Issues
