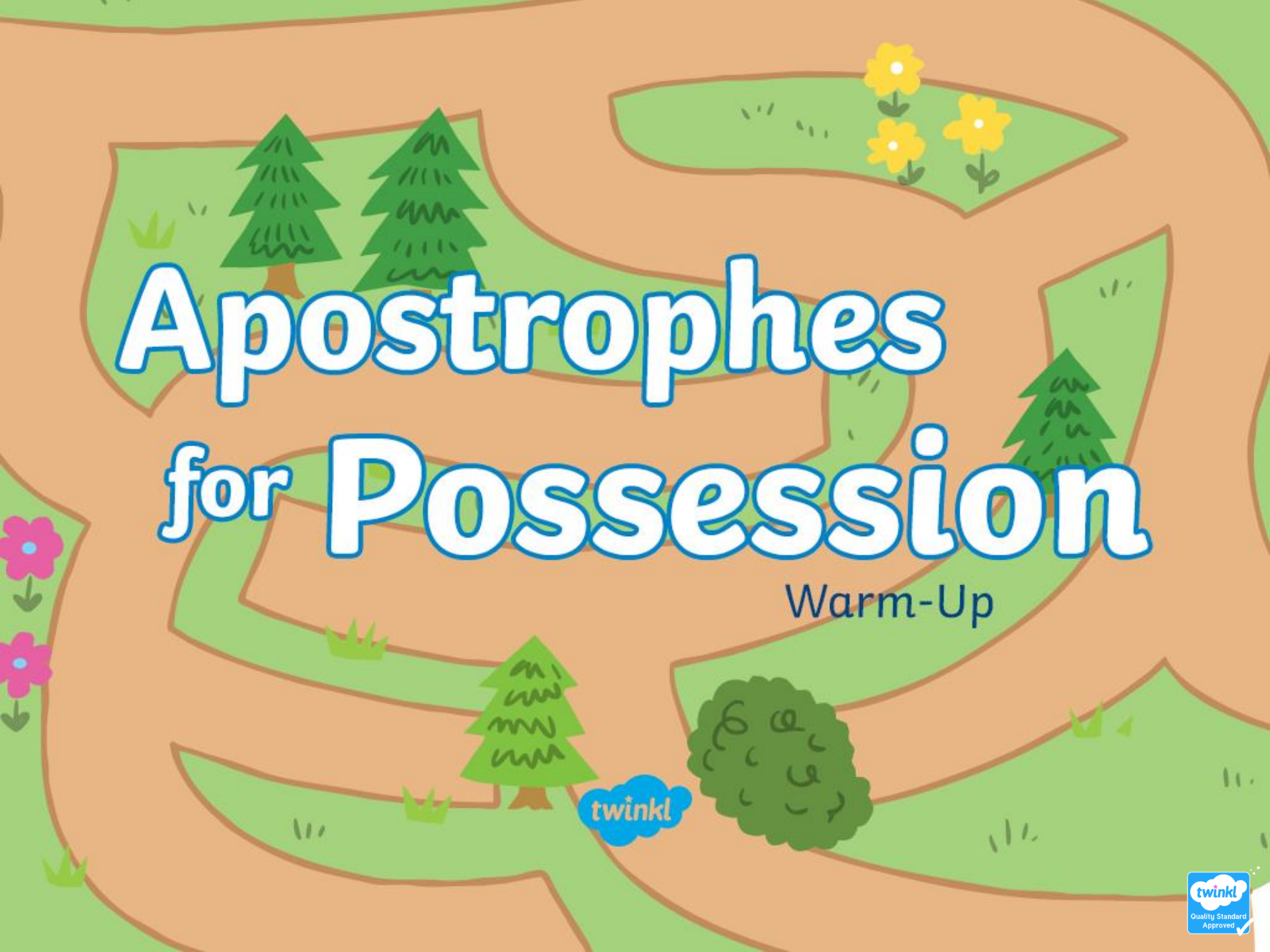

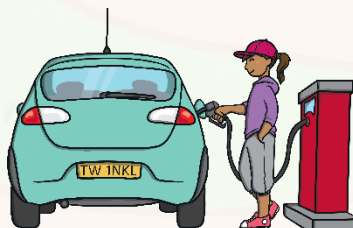
An apostrophe is used to show something belongs to somebody.

Kaylee



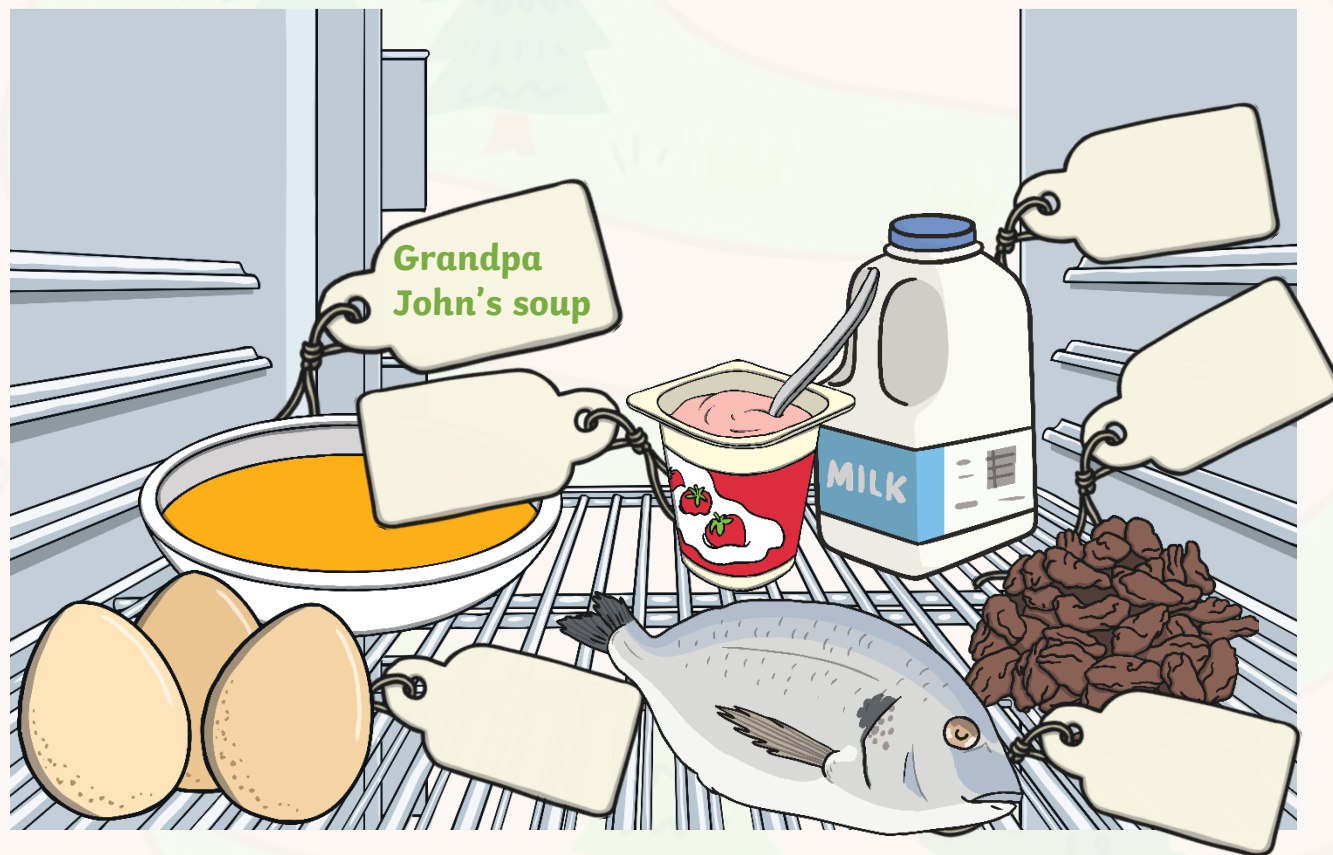
This is Kaylee's book.

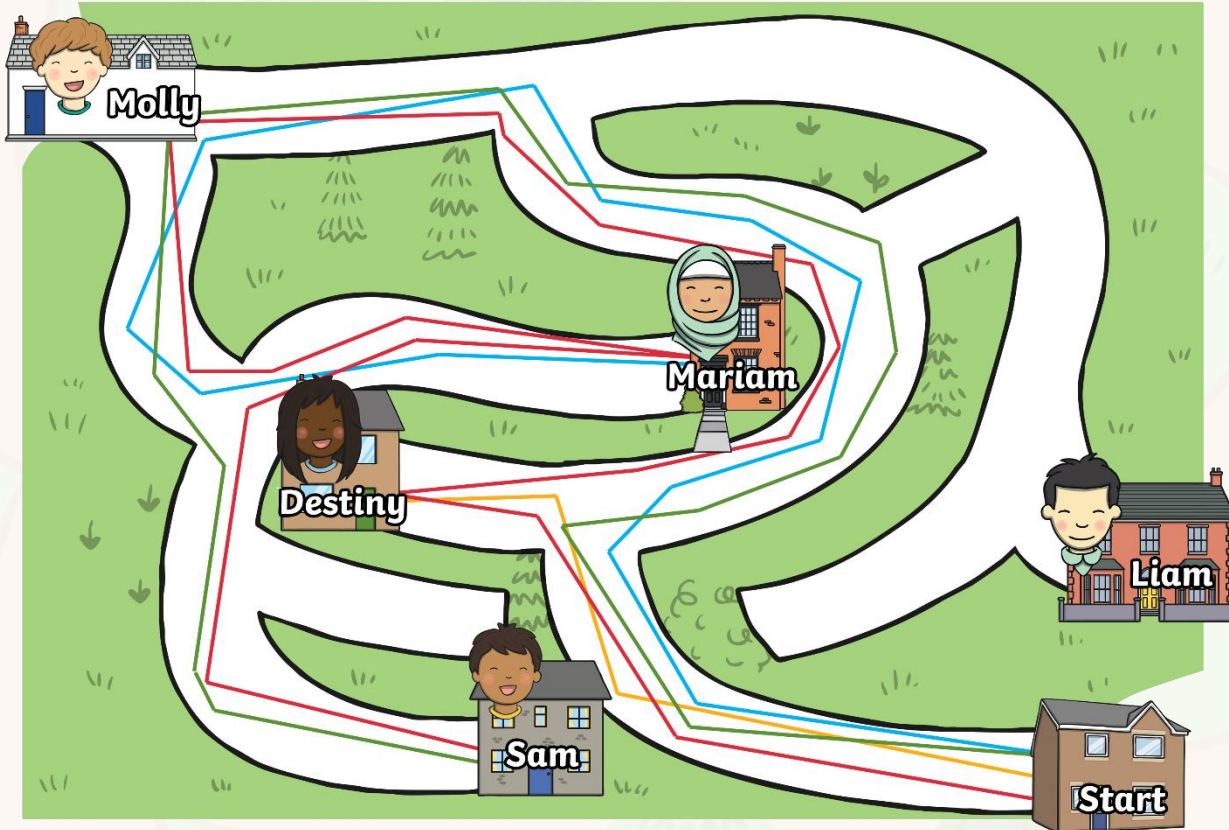
